Fulfillment of the Spring Feasts

<u>Exodus</u>	15	00 years later Jesus
Exodus 12:3 Each household takes a lamb	10th of Aviv	John 12:12-13 – Jesus (the Passover Lamb) enters Jerusalem and goes to the temple (triumphal entry).
10th to 14th of Aviv: Lamb is examined by each household to make sure it has no blemish before it's sacrificed.		Jesus examined in Jerusalem and is asked the most difficult questions. (Luke 20:1-47; Matthew 22:15-46; Mark 12:13- 34)
Exodus 12:6 Lamb is tied to the threshold of their dwelling at 9 am (3rd hour), slaughtered at 3 pm (9th hour)	 14th of Aviv	 9 am (3rd hour): Passover lamb tied to the altar of the temple in Jerusalem awaiting slaughter. 9 am (3rd hour): Jesus nailed to the cross (Mark 12:25). 3 pm (9th hour): Lamb is killed, high priest says "It is finished!" 3 pm (9th hour): Jesus takes his last breath, says "It is finished!" (John 19:30; Matthew 27:46; Mark 15:33-37; Luke 23:44-46)
(15th starts on evening of 14th) Lamb sacrificed at 3 pm on the 14th. Exodus 12:51 – The children of Israel roast the lamb, eat it completely, get Joseph's bones and leave Egypt on the 15th of Aviv by about midnight	15th of Aviv	15th of Aviv: Jesus buried by sundown on 14th, which becomes 15th at that hour. (John 15:43) Wrapped in burial clothes as is the "middle matzah" at Passover Seder, the <i>afikomen</i> ("the satisfaction"), and taken to Joseph of Arimethia's tomb. (John 6:51; 1 Cor 5:7-8)
Exodus 14:2 – Children of Israel camp by the Red Sea, which "opened" for them to cross. Exodus 14:24 – "In the morning watch" (still 17th of Aviv) they come up on the other side and look back and see Pharaoh and his army drowned in the Red Sea. This is the <i>Festival of Firstfruits</i> .	17th of Aviv (3 days later)	Mark 6:2 – Sunday (began Saturday at sundown) the tomb is empty. John 20:17 – Jesus ascends to the Father as <i>Firstfruits offering</i> . Gathers "sheaves" of others whose graves were opened that day and were resurrected from the dead as "firstfruits"; an offering to the Father.
3rd month: Exodus 19:1 – Children of Israel go 47 day journey from 17th of Aviv and arrive at Mt. Sinai to receive ten commandments and "become God's holy nation," kingdom of priests," His bride. Leviticus 23 – Festival of Shavuot	49 days later	Shavuot/Pentecost Luke 24:44-49 – Jesus said to tarry in Jerusalem to wait for "the promise of the Father." Acts 2:1 – "When Pentecost (Shavuot) had fully come…" 3rd (*4th) spring feast fulfilled.
